Subject: Addressing the Challenges of County Feeder Roads in Lamu County.

Mr. Speaker Sir, I beg to give the following Notice of Motion

Aware that, feeder roads are crucial for connecting rural areas to main roads, facilitating access to markets, schools, healthcare facilities, and other essential services. In our County and in Kenya at large, many feeder roads are in poor condition, hindering socio-economic development and contributing to regional disparities

Further aware that, feeder roads are very essential in promoting economic growth, reducing poverty, and enhancing the quality of life for rural communities.

Concerned that, the current state of disrepair of many feeder roads, which impedes access to vital services and markets. Issues such as inadequate maintenance, poor design, and insufficient funding have exacerbated these challenges.

Recognizing the existence of policies and manuals, such as the "ROAD DESIGN MANUAL Volume 1 - Geometric Design" by the Kenya National Highways Authority (KeNHA), which provides guidelines for

road design and maintenance and reports from oversight bodies, such as the Kenya

Anti-Corruption Commission, which have identified challenges in the management and maintenance of feeder roads.

Now therefore, this Assembly urges the County Executive Committee Member for Transport and Infrastructure to:

1. Conduct a Comprehensive Audit on feeder roads
2. Develop a Feeder Roads Improvement Plan
3. Allocate Adequate Funding on feeder roads
4. Enhance Technical Capacity
5. Establish Monitoring and Evaluation Mechanisms
6. Engage Local Communities
7. Report to the County Assembly biannually on all feeder roads
