8. **MOTION - URGENT REHABILITATION OF DILAPIDATED ROADS  
WITHIN LAMU COUNTY.**

*Mr. Speaker Sir, I beg to move the following motion*

**AWARE THAT**, Infrastructure development, particularly road networks, is key enabler of socio-economic growth and access to essential services

**FURTHER AWARE THAT**, many roads across various wards in Lamu County are in a dilapidated and impassible state, especially during the rainy seasons, thereby hindering movements, trade and access to health care, education, and emergency services

**COGNIZANT THAT**, the Constitution of Kenya and the Fourth Schedule assign county governments the responsibility of county roads.

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**CONCERNED** that, the continued neglect of these roads poses serious safety risks and contributes to economic marginalization of affected communities

**NOW THEREFORE**, this Assembly urges the County Executive Committee Member responsible for Infrastructure, Roads and Public Works to:

1. Conduct an immediate assessment of all dilapidated and impassable roads;
2. Prioritize the rehabilitation and grading of roads that affect access to hospitals, Schools, markets and administrative centres;
3. Allocate sufficient budgetary allocation in the supplementary or upcoming budget for road rehabilitation;
4. Submit a report to this Assembly within 60 days on progress and planned interventions

**9. \*\* MOTION - ESTABLISHMENT OF DAYCARE CENTRES BY THE COUNTY GOVERNMENT OF LAMU**

*Mr. Speaker Sir, I beg to move the following motion*

**AWARE** that Article 53(1)(e) of the Constitution of Kenya provides that every child has the right to equal protection and parental care, which includes adequate provision of childcare facilities;

**FURTHER AWARE** that many mothers working within County offices, markets, and other institutions face challenges in balancing work and parenting responsibilities due to the absence of nearby, affordable, and safe childcare facilities;

**NOTING** that the absence of such facilities often affects productivity, mental wellness, and the overall socio-economic participation of mothers and guardians in the workforce;

**CONCERNED** that leaving children without proper care exposes them to neglect, insecurity, and adverse developmental challenges. Also, sometimes working mothers have no househelps or family members living near them. This forces them to leave their children with neighbours or even abscon from work for some days.

**Cognizant** that the County Government of Lamu has a Constitutional obligation to promote social welfare, protect the rights of children, and support parents in carrying out their responsibilities properly.

**THIS HOUSE RESOLVES** that the County Government of Lamu establishes daycare centres within close proximity to County offices, major markets, and other public institutions; and that these centres be managed, maintained, and regulated by the County Government to ensure quality, safety, and affordability, thereby assisting working mothers and guardians to check on their children conveniently while discharging their duties;

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**FURTHER RESOLVES** that the County Executive Committee Member for Finance, in consultation with the County Executive Committee Member for Education, Gender and Social welfare, sets aside adequate funds in the subsequent County Supplementary Budget to facilitate the establishment, staffing, and sustainable operation of such daycare centres across Lamu County.
