MCA Amina Hassan Bwanamkuu(Nominated): Thank you Madam Speaker.

Cabro Lane in Faza Ward

Madam Speaker, on behalf of Honorable Mohamed About I rise pursuant to Standing Order 41(2)(C) to seek a Statement from the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Transport and Public Works on matters; Cabro lane in Faza Town.

Madam Speaker, I appreciate the County Government on its move towards the construction of Cabro lane in Faza Town and in other areas within the County.

Madam Speaker, the construction of these lanes has caused multiple problems as far as water drainage is concerned.

Madam Speaker, this happened a time before and informed the CECM concerned and renovation was done. However, when it rains, some families are forced to drain rain water outside their houses. A good example of this is a House belonging to Madam Jamila.

She is forced to migrate the House because all of her properties will be destroyed by the said water. Drugs and other medical kits in Faza Hospital were destroyed recently on the same note.

Madam Speaker, the contractors should not be paid before such issues are taken care of.

Madam Speaker, I seek to know the following from the Chairperson of the Departmental Committee on Transport and Public Works on the following: -

1. What will the County Government do towards the said situation?
2. When will this problem be solved once and for all?
3. What will be done to the situation of Madam Jamila and Faza Hospital?

[Temporary Speaker (MCA Beatrice Wamaitha Munge)]: Any addition to that Statement?

MCA Zahara Shee Mohamed(Nominated): Thank you Madam Speaker. On addition to this Statement, the drainage system is all over the County within the last 10 years. There now putting cabros in every villages and towns, but the main problem is people are involved on the ground. But the major problem is that they don't know which project to start with between the drainage system or the cabros.

MCA Shekhuna Abbas Shekhuna(Mkomani): Asante sana Bi Spika kwa kuweza kunipa nafasi kama hii ili nchangie katika hii shida iliyopo. Kusema kweli Bi Spika hili swala la Cabro limekuwa donda sugu na hakuna njia mbadala ya kupitisha maji iwapo mvua ya mafuriko itatokea.
