NOTICES OF MOTION

Purchase of honey circus exostace and sugnation of disposal site in Lamu County

MCA Aisha Ali Abdulrahman (*Nominated*): Thank you Mr Deputy Speaker. Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, I beg to give the following notice of motion: -

Pursuant to Standing Order 57(1), that aware that proper sanitation and waste management are fundamental public health and environment conservation in Lamu County.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, majority of residents in the County rely on pit latrine which requires regular emptiness to prevent overflow, contamination of water sources and spread of diseases.

COGNIZANT THAT, the County faces inadequate availability of honey suckers forcing residents rely on safe and informal method of waste disposal.

NOTING THAT, lack of affordable and accessible exostace services has led to environmental pollution and pleasant living condition and increased health risk.

RECOGNIZANT THAT, acquisition of County honey suckers which residents can hire at subsidized rates would improve sanitation services while ensuring safe and regulated waste management.

FURTHER RECOGNIZANT THAT, the designation of specific and well managed disposal site for collected waste necessary prevent environmental deration and ensure compliance with public health standards.

THIS ASSEMBLY THEREFORE RESOLVES THAT: -

- ✓ The County Executive Committee Member in charge of sanitation and public health procures adequate honey suckers (exostace truck) to serve various parts of the Lamu County.
- ✓ The County Government establishes a structured and affordable hire system to enable residents access exostace services at subsidized rates.
- ✓ The Departmental identifies, develops and gazette designated site for safe disposal and treatment of waste collected from pit latrines.
- ✓ The County Executive allocate sufficient fund in the annual budget for the purchases, operation and maintenance of the exostace.
- ✓ The Department develops clear deadlines and regulation on waste collection, transportation and disposal to ensure environmental safety, transportation and disposal to ensure environmental safety.
- ✓ The County Government undertakes public awareness campaigns on proper sanitation practices and the availability of the exostace services.

[Deputy Speaker (MCA Paul Kimani Njuguna)]: Next notice of motion.

MCA Beatrice Wamaitha Munge (Nominated): Thank you Mr Deputy Speaker. Mr Deputy Speaker Sir, I beg to give the following notice of motion: -

Pursuant to Standing Order 57(1), that aware that a significant number of residents in Lamu County occupy land as squatters without formal ownership documents despite having deeds in such land for many years.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, lack of secure land tenure has hindered social economic development limited access credit facilities and contributed land related conflict within the County. Absence of legal ownership discourages investment in land development and undermines proper planning and provision of access services.

COGNIZANT THAT, the process of land regularization and issuance of title deeds would enhance tenure security, promote orderly, development and improve livelihoods of affected residents.

RECOGNIZING THAT, the County Government in collaboration with the National Government has a law in facilitating land adjudication, settlement scheme and regularization processes allocation of adequate financial resources as necessary to support surveying, adjudication, documentation and issuance of ownership document.

THIS ASSEMBLY THEREFORE RESOLVES THAT: -

- i. The County Executive Committee Member in charge of lands, physical planning and urban development in collaboration with the National Government to initiate and implement a comprehensive program for the legalization and regularization of squatter's land in Lamu County.
- ii. The Department conducts a Countywide survey and mapping of all squatter's settlements to establish the extend a nature of land occupation.
- iii. The County Government facilitate land adjudication and issuance of ownership document including title deeds or other legal tenure instruments.
- iv. The County Executive develops clear guidelines and criteria for eligibility to ensure fairness, transparency and accountability in the process.
- v. The County Government undertakes public participation and sensitization to involve affected communities in the regularization process.
- vi. The County Executive repairs and submit a detailed co-statement for the entire exercise including surveying, planning adjudication and entity.

- vii. The County Government allocates adequate funds in the annual budget and subsequent financial plans to support the implementation of the squatter's land legalization program.
