9. MOTION : ESTABLISHMENT AND EQUIPPING OF FIRE STATIONS IN LAMU COUNTY**

Hon. Speaker, Sir, I beg to move the following Motion: -

THAT, aware that fire outbreaks pose a significant risk to lives, property, and the environment in Lamu County;

FURTHER AWARE THAT the County currently faces inadequate fire response infrastructure, limited fire fighting equipment, and delayed emergency response services;

COGNIZANT THAT rapid urbanization, increased commercial activities, and use of flammable materials have heightened the risk of fire incidents across the County;

NOTING THAT the absence of well-equipped and strategically located fire stations has led to delayed response to fire emergencies, resulting in preventable loss of lives and destruction of property;

RECOGNIZING THAT establishment of modern fire stations, equipped with appropriate fire fighting equipment and trained personnel, would significantly enhance emergency response capacity and public safety;

FURTHER RECOGNIZING THAT investment in fire and rescue services is a critical function of County Governments in ensuring disaster preparedness and management;

THIS ASSEMBLY THEREFORE RESOLVES THAT:

1. The County Executive Committee Member in charge of Public Works, Disaster Management, and Emergency Services establishes fully equipped fire stations in strategic locations across Lamu County;
2. The County Government procures modern fire fighting equipment, including fire engines, water bowsers, and protective gear, to enhance response capacity;

3. The Department recruits and trains adequate fire fighting personnel to ensure efficient and professional emergency response services;
4. The County Executive allocates sufficient funds in the annual budget for construction, equipping, staffing, and maintenance of the fire stations;
5. The Department develops and implements fire safety policies, guidelines, and response protocols;
6. The County Government conducts regular public awareness campaigns on fire prevention, safety measures, and emergency response procedures; and
7. The County Executive collaborates with national government agencies and other stakeholders to strengthen disaster preparedness and response mechanisms.

10.*MOTION-DIVERSIFICATION OF LIVELIHOODS AND TRAINING ON ALTERNATIVE LIVELIHOODS TO REDUCE PRESSURE ON NATURAL RESOURCES IN LAMU COUNTY**

Hon. Speaker, Sir, I beg to move the following Motion: -

THAT, aware that a majority of residents in Lamu County depend directly on natural resources such as forests, fisheries, and land for their livelihoods;

FURTHER AWARE THAT overreliance on these resources has led to environmental degradation, including deforestation, overfishing, and depletion of biodiversity;

COGNIZANT THAT limited access to alternative sources of income has contributed to unsustainable exploitation of natural resources;

NOTING THAT diversification of livelihoods through skills development and training can provide sustainable income-generating opportunities while conserving the environment;

RECOGNIZING THAT investment in alternative livelihoods such as eco-tourism, beekeeping, aquaculture, climate-smart agriculture, and small-scale enterprises can reduce dependency on natural resources and enhance economic resilience;

FURTHER RECOGNIZING THAT empowering communities with knowledge, skills, and access to resources is key to achieving sustainable development in Lamu County;

THIS ASSEMBLY THEREFORE RESOLVES THAT:

1. The County Executive Committee Members in charge of Trade and Agriculture develops and implements a comprehensive program for diversification of livelihoods in Lamu County;
2. The County Government establishes structured training programs on alternative livelihoods, including but not limited to beekeeping, aquaculture, eco-tourism, handicrafts, and climate-smart agriculture and market linkages for products generated through alternative livelihoods;
3. The Department facilitates access to financial support, grants, and microcredit to enable residents to start and sustain alternative income-generating activities;
4. The County Executive partners with relevant stakeholders, including national government agencies, NGOs, and private sector players, to support training, mentorship, and market access;
5. The Department conducts public awareness campaigns on sustainable use of natural resources and the benefits of livelihood diversification; and
6. The County Executive ensures equitable access to the program, with special focus on youth, women, and marginalized groups. *(Hon. Beatrice Wamaitha)*
