NOTICES OF MOTION

SUBJECT: PROMOTION OF EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT EDUCATION
(ECDE)

Mr. Speaker Sir, I beg to give the following notice of motion:-

THAT AWARE THAT the Basic Education Act No. 14 of 2013 devolves the management and funding of Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE) to County Governments, making it a core county function;

COGNISANT THAT quality early childhood education is the foundation of lifelong learning, cognitive development, and socio-economic wellbeing of every child;

CONCERNED THAT current budgetary allocations toward ECDE in this County are grossly inadequate, resulting in understaffed centres, poor infrastructure, lack of learning materials and low remuneration of ECDE teachers and caregivers;

NOTING THAT many children aged 3–6 years, particularly those from low-income households and marginalised areas of this County, are unable to access quality ECDE services due to inadequate public investment;

ACKNOWLEDGING THAT research consistently demonstrates that every shilling invested in early childhood development yields far greater long-term returns in education, health and economic productivity than investment at any later stage of life;

RECOGNISING THAT numerous ECDE centres in this County lack basic sanitation, safe drinking water, meals programmes, qualified personnel, and age-appropriate learning materials;

This Assembly resolved that, the County Executive shall:

1. Ensure at least fifteen percent (15%) of the County Education sector budget is allocated specifically to ECDE services and infrastructure.
2. Develop and implement a clear and sustainable remuneration framework for all ECDE teachers and caregivers employed by the County.
3. Procure and distribute adequate, age-appropriate teaching and learning materials to all public ECDE centres annually.
4. Establish or expand a school feeding and nutrition programme targeting ECDE learners in vulnerable communities.
5. Conduct an audit of all public ECDE centres within sixty (60) days and table the audit report before the County Assembly. (*Hon. John Mburu*)
