5. MOTION- ENHANCING EDUCATIONAL STANDARDS AND INCREASE GRADUATE NUMBERS IN LAMU COUNTY

I beg to give the following notice of motion:-

AWARE THAT, Lamu County aims to uplift its educational standards, increase the number of graduates, and foster socio-economic development. This calls for the collective effort of all stakeholders to ensure that every child in Lamu County has access to quality education and the opportunity to succeed.

FURTHER AWARE THAT, the function of pre-primary education is devolved to county governments, as outlined in the Fourth Schedule of the Constitution;

COGNIZANT THAT, Article 53 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 stipulates that every child has the right to free and compulsory basic education;

CONCERNED THAT, Lamu County has been experiencing below-average educational outcomes, evidenced by a lower number of graduates compared to national averages;

RECOGNIZING THAT, improving ECD- Educational standards is essential for the socio-economic development of the county;

NOW THEREFORE, this Assembly resolves to:

1. Strengthen Early Childhood Development Education (ECDE):

- Ensure all ECDE centers are registered and meet the required standards, enabling them to receive county support.
- Recruit qualified ECDE teachers and provide continuous

2. Enhance Primary and Secondary Education:

- Collaborate with the Teachers Service Commission (TSC) to address teacher shortages by advocating for the deployment of more teachers to Lamu County.
 - Invest in infrastructure development, including classrooms, laboratories, and libraries, to create conducive learning environments.
 - professional development to enhance teaching quality.
 - Implement mentorship programs involving local professionals to motivate and guide students.
3. **Improve Access to Educational Resources:**
- Establish a County Education Development Fund to provide bursaries and scholarships to needy and deserving students, ensuring equitable access to education.
 - Provide learning materials and resources, including digital tools, to enhance the quality of education.
4. **Promote Community and Stakeholder Engagement:**
- Organize regular forums with parents, teachers, and community leaders to discuss and address educational challenges.
 - Encourage local communities to participate in school management and development projects.
5. **Monitor and Evaluate Educational Outcomes:**
- Establish a task force to monitor the implementation of educational programs and assess their impact on student performance and graduation rates.
 - Regularly publish reports on educational progress to maintain transparency and accountability.
