8. *MOTION – IMPROVEMENT OF MAIN ACCESS ROADS THROUGH INSTALLATION OF CULVERTS, PROPER DRAINAGE SYSTEMS AND STREET LIGHTING IN LAMU COUNTY

Hon. Speaker, Sir, I beg to move the Motion: -

THAT, aware that an efficient and well-maintained road network is essential for socio-economic development, accessibility, and public safety in Lamu County;

FURTHER AWARE THAT many main access roads within the County lack essential infrastructure such as culverts, proper drainage systems, and adequate street lighting;

COGNIZANT THAT absence of culverts and drainage systems leads to flooding, road damage, and disruption of transport during rainy seasons;

NOTING THAT poor lighting along major roads increases insecurity, road accidents, and limits movement and economic activities during night hours;

RECOGNIZING THAT installation of culverts, construction of effective drainage systems, and provision of street lighting will enhance road durability, improve safety, and support economic activities within the County;

FURTHER RECOGNIZING THAT investment in road infrastructure contributes to improved connectivity, trade, and service delivery across Lamu County;

THIS ASSEMBLY THEREFORE RESOLVES THAT:

1. The County Executive Committee Member in charge of Roads, Public Works and Transport undertakes a comprehensive assessment of all main access roads in Lamu County to identify areas requiring culverts, drainage systems, and street lighting;
2. The County Government installs appropriate culverts and constructs durable drainage systems along major access roads to prevent flooding and road damage;
3. The Department ensures installation of adequate and energy-efficient street lighting along key roads to enhance security and facilitate movement at night;
4. The County Executive allocates sufficient funds in the annual budget for the design, construction, and maintenance of the road infrastructure;
5. The Department develops standards and guidelines to ensure quality, durability, and sustainability of the works; and
6. The County Government establishes a routine maintenance program to ensure the continued functionality of culverts, drainage systems, and street lighting.

9. ****MOTION: OUTBREAK OF DENGUE FEVER AND CHIKUNGUNYA IN LAMU COUNTY.**

Mr. Speaker Sir, I beg to move of the following Motion:-

AWARE THAT, Article 43(1)(a) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010 guarantees every person the right to the highest attainable standard of health, including the right to healthcare services;

FURTHER AWARE THAT, county governments are responsible for county health services under Part 2 of the Fourth Schedule to the Constitution;

CONCERNED THAT, Lamu County has recently experienced an outbreak of Dengue Fever and Chikungunya, which are mosquito-borne viral diseases that pose a significant threat to public health, livelihoods, education, tourism, and economic activities within the County;

NOTING THAT, the diseases are characterized by high fever, severe headaches, joint and muscle pains, fatigue, skin rashes, and in severe cases may lead to hospitalization and other serious health complications;

FURTHER NOTING THAT, the spread of the diseases has been exacerbated by poor waste management, stagnant water, inadequate public awareness, and insufficient vector control measures in some parts of the County;

COGNIZANT THAT, timely intervention through surveillance, vector control, public sensitization, provision of medical supplies, and intergovernmental collaboration is critical in containing the outbreak and safeguarding public health;

NOW THEREFORE, this County Assembly resolves that the County Executive Committee Member responsible for Health:

1. Declares the Dengue Fever and Chikungunya outbreak a matter of urgent public health concern and submits to the County Assembly, within fourteen (14) days, a comprehensive status report on the extent of the outbreak, affected areas, response measures undertaken, and challenges encountered.
2. Intensifies disease surveillance, testing, diagnosis, treatment, and reporting mechanisms in all health facilities across the County.

3. Undertakes immediate countywide mosquito control interventions, including fumigation, elimination of mosquito breeding sites, drainage of stagnant water, environmental sanitation campaigns, and proper waste management.
4. Launches an aggressive public awareness and health education campaign through radio stations, social media platforms, public meetings, schools, religious institutions, and other appropriate channels to educate residents on prevention and control measures.
5. Ensures adequate availability of medicines, testing kits, protective equipment, and healthcare personnel in all public health facilities to effectively manage affected patients.
6. Collaborates with the Ministry of Health, Kenya Medical Research Institute (KEMRI), development partners, and other relevant agencies to mobilize technical and financial support for outbreak containment.
7. Establishes a County Emergency Response Team to coordinate interventions and provide weekly updates on the status of the outbreak until it is fully contained.
8. Submits quarterly reports to the County Assembly on the implementation of the interventions and the progress made in controlling the outbreak.
